Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

**Request for Action
November 15, 2023**

To: Mayor Karen Bass, Councilmember Hernandez, and Councilmember De Leon

We, the **Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council** declare that on **November 15, 2023**, a Brown Act notice public meeting was held by the **Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council** with a quorum of 9 board members present and that by a vote of :

10 (number) yes, _____ (number) no, and 1 (number) abstentions

The Lincoln Heights Neighborhood Council requests that the Los Angeles City Council submit a resolution of support for Representative Cori Bush's Congressional Resolution calling for an immediate de-escalation and cease-fire in occupied Palestine and Israel.

We mourn the loss of innocent Palestinian and Israeli lives since the Nakba of 1948 and stand in solidarity with the Palestinian people against decades of occupation, oppression, and blockade.

We, the people of Lincoln Heights, understand the violence of displacement, as we fight against our own erasure, both cultural and physical. We understand that the billions of dollars sent to Israel does not only ensure continued collective punishment for Palestinians, but also directly affects the people of Lincoln Heights, as those funds could be used to provide housing, healthcare, food, and resources to our people, many of whom live below the poverty line.

We understand the beauty of a multi-generational home, as well as the fracturing effect of gentrification, as our families who have lived here for decades are forcibly removed from their homes in the name of development and progress. We understand the collective devastation when our old growth trees are destroyed without consideration of both the sacred and symbiotic

relationship we have with them, as the takaape' waashut is to us what the olive tree is to Palestinians.

We understand systems of oppression that work to silence our voices and take away our power. We understand that the people of Palestine deserve to live a life free of occupation and with the right to self-determination. We ask that our city council call for an end to the brutal violence in Palestine, where war crimes are being committed daily by the state of Israel.

Where over 11,000 Palestinians have been killed, and more than 40% of these deaths being children. Where 70% of Gaza's 2.3 million people have had to flee from their homes in a clear case of ethnic cleansing. Where 39 journalists have been killed while trying to show the world this genocide. Where 160 healthcare workers have been killed while attempting to care for the never ending stream of injured Palestinians.

Where what's known as "the world's largest open-air prison" of Gaza has been subjected to unbearable living conditions imposed by the state of Israel, including a full air, land and sea blockade, and no ability to move freely in or out. Where this blockade on Gaza has caused a 42% unemployment rate, while 84% of the population relies on humanitarian aid, 41% of Palestinians have too little food, and 60% of Palestinian children are anemic. Where prior to this current water shortage, only 1% of Gaza's population has access to safe drinking water, leaving Gaza's population – half of whom are children – increasingly vulnerable to waterborne diseases, infections, and dehydration.

An immediate ceasefire is not only necessary but the very least that we can do. As our federal government remains silent and complicit in this genocide funded by our tax dollars, please use your position of power to call for its immediate end.
