The CIS process was enable by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Councils rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

### **COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENT**

The Sun Valley Area Neighborhood Council, SVANC, in its regular meeting of August 13, 2024, passed the following community impact statement by a vote of: 9 yes, 0 no, 4 absent, 1 abstained, 0 recused, and 0 ineligible.

The Sun Valley Area Neighborhood Council strongly opposes Council File 24-0867, which proposes to limit the number of terms a community stakeholder can be part of their neighborhood council and change the composition of the neighborhood council by mandating a youth seat.

Neighborhood councils are facing many challenges, but the recurrence of the same individuals serving on their governing boards is not one of them. The reason those individuals continue to serve as board members is because the community they represent continues to elect them. If the community felt they were being misrepresented, they would've voted out those members. Elections are open to everyone and every seat can be challenged. Let the community continue deciding who their local representatives are.

The city council should not impose the composition of a neighborhood council. Each neighborhood council is unique given the uniqueness of the community it represents and that is why each neighborhood council has its own set of bylaws. Bylaws can be changed to accommodate the needs of its community. Let the community dictate the structure of their bylaws. Many neighborhood councils struggle with filling up the youth position.

The best way to make sure a neighborhood council has diversity and leadership growth is through elections and the vote of the community. Board members should have no limit to the number of terms they serve and neighborhood council's board composition should not be decided by City Council. This is wrong and it defies the charter which states NCs are empowered to choose their own leaders.
