The CIS process was enable by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter listed on the Commission's agenda, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Councils rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter not listed on the agenda, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

We share this information to assist you with the docketing neighborhood council items before your board/commission. If you have questions and/or concerns, please contact the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at empowerla@lacity.org.

Oppose Council File: 24-0867

Neighborhood Council Bylaws / Youth Participation / Diversity Increase / Leadership Growth

August 21, 2024

The North Hollywood Northeast Neighborhood Council strongly opposes the proposed changes in Council File CF-24-0867. Our points are as follows:

- On the second page of the "The Plan for a Citywide System of Neighborhood Councils," it states
 that "Certified Neighborhood Councils shall be as independent, self-governing, and self-directed
 as possible." Moving to tell the Neighborhood Councils how to distribute their board members
 is for us to decide, and as your motion states, each of our 99 Neighborhood Councils are vastly
 different and tailored to our communities.
- Although our Neighborhood Council recognizes the need of developing youth participation and increased diversity and leadership growth, we also acknowledge that our council, as well as councils like ours, often have trouble filling our existing youth seat, due to the sheer amount of committed time it takes to be a member of the council.
- Additionally, it is unclear what your definition of "youth" means. All 15 of our Council Seats are eligible for anyone aged 18+, and this adjustment was required by DONE in the first place we previously had more seats available to 16+ but were told we had to adjust the ages.
 - On January 14, 2021, we were told by our NEA that we must adjust our Community Interest eligibility from 16 years to 18 years "The Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (Department) has also amended NHNENC's bylaws to implement the Community Interest Stakeholder Ordinance & Uniform Age Ordinance. These changes are necessary for the City's effective administration of upcoming Neighborhood Council elections."
- Imposing term limits on these seats discounts the breadth of knowledge that our sitting council
 members have. While our NC recognizes that having the same people running the NCs time and
 again could pose an issue, our NC recently reduced its numbers due to lack of community
 involvement; therefore, imposing term limits would negatively impact our community, as we
 would continue to have issues with having a full board and reaching quorum.

There is work to be done to make the neighborhood councils work better - paying these elected officials; promoting the NC system as part of the civics programs at the high schools in the LAUSD system; make joining councils easier by working with the NCs to promote hybrid and virtual meetings; giving NCs a better budget that would support more outreach; rework the rules about holding events to actually foster community engagement - the list goes on.

Term limits and arbitrarily assuming the youth will automatically mean better functioning, more diverse councils is not the way forward. While we agree with the sentiment of the motion that we want more youth involvement, increased diversity, and more leadership growth, we strongly oppose this council file.
