Dear Councilmembers,

About the request for three-quarters of a million dollars by the City Attorney to pay for outside counsel to fight against affordable housing: did any of you have the opportunity to attend, in person, the final Coastal Commission meeting on the Venice Dell Affordable Housing project?

The City Attorney damaged the City of Los Angeles's relationship with the California Coastal Commission by refusing to send a representative. Instead, she disrespected the Commission by having a representative appear by Zoom — as if Commissioners weren't worthy of a trip.

The Commission approved the Venice Dell Project—unanimously.

Now the City Attorney has requested \$760,000 to fight the affordable housing project — a project that the City itself had previously approved.

We're in the midst of a terrible budget crisis: is this really the type of spending the Council wants to be known for right now.

In addition, as you know the City Attorney filed suit against the non-profit developers, accusing them of failing to build the very project the City has been stopping.

In December, a former Mid-city neighborhood council member characterized the City Attorney as "vindictive" to me. I thought — he must be exaggerating. Yet, suing the Affordable Housing providers in this case certainly has the appearance of being vindictive. The City Attorney lost her fight against them at the Commission level. This seems Donald Trumpish, no?

We have just seen ruthless cuts, at the federal level, to monies funding food for people living in poverty. Those Angelenos and other would be better served than giving three-quarters of a million dollars to outside council. Keeping people in homes, and fed, dramatically reduces city and county costs.

As twenty-six-year CD 11 resident and a devout Angeleno, I urge you to reject this ridiculous request from the City Attorney and use taxpayer dollars responsibly.
