If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

### **Community Impact Statement CF# 24-1094**

The Wilmington Neighborhood Council supports our Councilman with regard to Council File 24-1094 Work Experience In Lieu of Education Requirements / Examination Qualifications / Hiring Process.

A policy like that recommended in the motion would help bridge the socioeconomic divide within disadvantaged communities of color. Wilmington is such a community.

In a community like ours, the college graduate rate for a bachelor's degree is extremely low at 8.9% compared to the rest of the county at 36.5%.

With over 55% of our population under the age of 18 we have a 44.7% employment rate yet the college graduate rate for a bachelor's degree is extremely low at 8.9% compared to the rest of the county at 36.5%. These statistics do not take into consideration those who are no longer in the workforce which leads one to believe are youth are foregoing an education and entering the workforce earlier.

An opportunity to utilize work experience in lieu of an education would help to provide good paying jobs to those who have not otherwise attended college and bridge the socio economic divide.

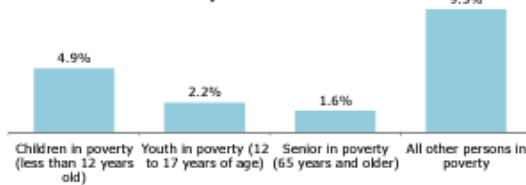

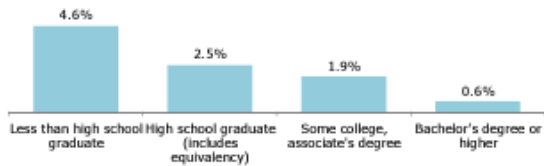
INCOME BELOW POVERTY LEVEL

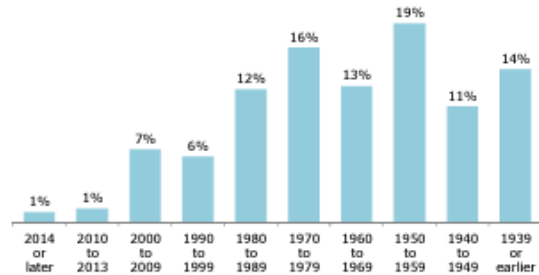

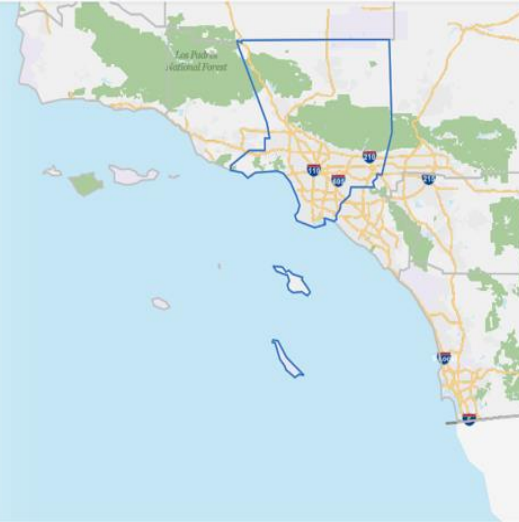
