

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to steps that can be taken to enhance safety for the City's library workforce and its patrons, inclusive of enhanced security, workplace violence prevention plans and trainings, and related matters.

Recommendation for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Park – Padilla):

1. CONCUR with the APLCE Committee action of February 25, 2025 for recommendation Nos. 2-6.
2. INSTRUCT the Police Department's Security Services Division, the Office of Unarmed Response, and the Los Angeles Public Library (LAPL) Department, to report on immediate steps that can be taken to enhance safety for the City's library workforce and its patrons, inclusive of enhanced security, workplace violence prevention plans and trainings as required by SB 533, capital improvements, enforcement of library suspensions and faster response times from law enforcement to calls for service.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted

Summary:

On March 5, 2025, your Committee considered Motion (Price – Hutt) relative to instructing the Chief Legislative Analyst to report on a pilot program for the distribution of naloxone in South Los Angeles and it be funded through the Opioid Settlement funding.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to concur with the Arts, Parks, Libraries and Community Enrichment Committee action of February 25, 2025 for recommendation Nos. 2-6, and amend recommendation No. 1 to remove the Chief Legislative Analyst, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
