Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: The Silver Lake Neighborhood Council supports Council File 25-0002-S13 and AB467 (Fong). This act would extend the authorization for Neighborhood Councils to use alternate teleconferencing provisions to conduct meetings remotely until January 1, 2031. NCs play a vital role in advocating for their communities, financially supporting local schools and nonprofits, and ensuring that local government remains responsive to the diverse needs of Los Angeles residents. Though the Silver Lake NC has chosen to generally keep Governing Board meetings in person, the ability to periodically conduct them virtually has been instrumental. Moreover, many of our Committees have shifted to virtual

meetings, which lowers the barrier to entry and promotes greater public participation in the NC system. AB467 builds upon the provisions of SB411 (Portantino), which allowed NCs to use alternate teleconferencing methods. Extending these provisions ensures that NCs can continue to leverage technology to engage with their communities effectively, fostering greater civic involvement and inclusivity. The SLNC believes that this legislation is essential for preserving the integrity of the NC system and enhancing public access to local governance. We urge the City Council to adopt this resolution and include support for AB467 in the 2025-26 State Legislative Program.
