We declare that on date, a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held by the Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council (ERNC) at which a quorum was present. By a vote of 13 Ayes/0 Nos insert vote count, the ERNC adopted the following Community Impact Statement concerning Council File #25-0002-S86: S.246 hyperlinked to CF: https://cityclerk.lacity.org/lacityclerkconnect/index.cfm?fa=ccfi.viewrecord&cfnumber=25-0002-S86

Los Angeles is home to one of the largest immigrant populations in the country. Many long-term residents (some living here for decades) remain undocumented due to outdated federal laws. Without a path to legal status, these Angelenos face daily risks of detention, deportation, and family separation, despite being integral members of our communities and economy as abused by ICE.

The Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council Housing and Homelessness Committee supports Council File 25-0002-S86: S.2468 (Padilla) / Renewing Immigration Provisions of the Immigration Act of 1929, which urges the City of Los Angeles to include support for this federal legislation in its 2025–2026 Legislative Program. After 7 years of continuous residency with no criminal record, residents are able to apply for permanent residency. There is precedent for this action: similar legalization measures were enacted in 1940, 1958, and 1986, providing lawful permanent resident status to long-term residents who met comparable eligibility criteria. Removing the registry cutoff date would help thousands of Los Angeles residents finally access permanent residency and the stability they deserve.
