Summary:

On October 21, 2025, your Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered an September 26, 2025 Resolution (Blumenfield – Lee) and CLA report dated October 20, 2025, relative to establishing the City's position on S.2238 (Klobuchar) and H.R. 5221 (Baird), the Preventing Auto Recycling Theft Act. According to the Resolution, the financial burden of replacing stolen catalytic converters, coupled with the inconvenience of vehicle downtime, disproportionately affects lower-income communities and small businesses. Further, the absence of identifiable markings on catalytic converters makes it exceedingly difficult for law enforcement to trace stolen parts, prosecute offenders, and recover losses for victims. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the Resolution. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
