TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to establishing oversize vehicle parking restrictions along certain street segments of Little San Fernando Road, San Fernando Road, Olinda Avenue, and Penrose Street.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Padilla – Lee):

RESOLVE to:

- 1. PROHIBIT, pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 80.69.4, the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over 84 inches in height, during the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., along the following street segment:
 - a. Little San Fernando Road from Sunland Boulevard to Penrose Street
 - b. San Fernando Road from Sunland Boulevard to Penrose Street
 - c. Olinda Avenue from Little San Fernando Road to the cul-de-sac
 - d. Penrose Street from Little San Fernando Road to Bradley Avenue
- 2. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT), upon adoption of this Resolution, to post signs giving notice of a "tow away, no parking" restriction for oversize vehicles, with the specific hours detailed.
- 3. AUTHORIZE the LADOT to make technical corrections or clarifications to the above instructions in order to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On August 27, 2025, your Transportation Committee considered an August 8, 2025 Resolution (Padilla – Lee) relative to establishing oversize vehicle parking restrictions along certain street segments of Little San Fernando Road, San Fernando Road, Olinda Avenue, and Penrose Street, in Council District Six, as detailed in the Resolution and in Recommendation No. 1 above. Pursuant to LAMC Section 80.69.4, it is proposed that the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over 84 inches in height, during the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., be prohibited along the street segment as detailed in Recommendation No. 1. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended approval of the Resolution recommendations. This matter is now submitted to the Council for consideration.
