

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to establishing oversize vehicle parking restrictions along certain street segments of Southwest Boulevard, East 98th Street, McKinley Avenue, Wadsworth Avenue, and East 110th Street.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Harris-Dawson – Park):

RESOLVE to:

1. PROHIBIT, pursuant to California Vehicle Code Section 22507, the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over 84 inches in height, during all hours of the day, on both sides of the following street segments:
 - a. Southwest Boulevard, 500 feet east of Vermont Avenue
 - b. East 98th Street between Avalon Boulevard and Clovis Avenue
 - c. McKinley Avenue between 98th Street and East 99th Street
 - d. Wadsworth Avenue between 98th Street and East 99th Street
 - e. East 110th Street, 400 feet east of Vermont Avenue
2. DIRECT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT), upon adoption of this Resolution, to post signs giving notice of the above restrictions for oversize vehicles, with those specific hours detailed.
3. AUTHORIZE the LADOT to make technical corrections or clarifications to the above instructions in order to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On June 11, 2025, your Transportation Committee considered a June 4, 2025 Resolution (Lee – Blumenfield) relative to establishing oversize vehicle parking restrictions along certain street segments of Southwest Boulevard, East 98th Street, McKinley Avenue, Wadsworth Avenue, and East 110th Street, in Council District 8, as detailed in the Resolution and in Recommendation No. 1 above. Pursuant to California Vehicle Code Section 22507, it is proposed that the parking of vehicles that are in excess of 22 feet in length or over 84 inches in height, during all hours of the day, be prohibited along the street segments as detailed in Recommendation No. 1. After consideration and having

provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended approval of the Resolution recommendations. This matter is now submitted to the Council for consideration.
