Comments for Public Posting: I am a frequent user of the Hollywood Bike Lane as I live on Russell Avenue and do not own a car. The majority of my rides involve a parked car in the bike lane. Usual offenses occur by municipal trucks at the Salvation Army and parked cars where the lane begins by the 101 on the south side of the road, by 5750 Hollywood Blvd. I am a huge supporter of better bike lane enforcement, as those parked cars in the bike lanes force me into the road where cars are usually quite hostile. Hostility shows up in the form of honking, yelling, or insistance to return to the bike lane. I do not feel comfortable when cars are parked in the bike lane.
