The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Title: Automated Bike Lane Enforcement

Summary: The East Hollywood Neighborhood Council (EHNC) supports this motion to instruct the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to report on the feasibility of implementing a pilot project that would utilize cameras and related technologies for the enforcement of parking violations in bicycle lanes, along Hollywood Boulevard in Council District 13, including:

- An assessment of available parking enforcement technologies for enforcing bicycle lane parking violations, and the feasibility of contracting with relevant vendors.
- Recommendations for providing alternative payment options to under-resourced individuals facing parking citations as a result of automated enforcement programs.
- The staff and budget necessary to implement the proposed pilot.
- How revenue from a permanent program could be directed specifically to the LADOT to be earmarked for Active Transportation efforts.

In particular, the EHNC is encouraged to see how a permanent program can direct revenue towards bike lane maintenance, first and foremost, and expansion, secondarily. To drive adoption of infrastructure, the City must maintain safe and reliable infrastructure, and with drastic budget cuts, self-funding programs are crucial.

Thus, on behalf of our stakeholders, the East Hollywood Neighborhood Council supports the motion and stands ready to support CD13 and LADOT as they develop a pilot program for automated bike lane enforcement.
