SUBJECT: DEPARTMENT OF ANIMAL SERVICES FISCAL YEAR 2025-26 PROPOSED BUDGET

The Department of Animal Services (Department) has reviewed the Mayor's FY 2025-26 Proposed Budget. The Department understands that careful consideration was given and difficult decisions needed to be made to prepare a balanced budget at this time. Recognizing the precarious financial situation facing the City, we anticipated that some sacrifices would have to be made as we continue to move forward. The Department appreciates the members of the Budget and Finance Committee and the entire City Council for the opportunity to share just how the Department will be impacted by this proposed budget and our recommended changes to help mitigate negative impacts.

The Department of Animal Services is a public safety agency. Public safety is the City of Los Angeles' primary obligation to its residents. A safe city is one in which trained Animal Control Officers are available at any time of day to respond to dangerous animal calls in a timely manner and handle situations involving animals-at-large without or with minimal injury to the public. Our field staff is required to answer such calls daily. A safe city is also one in which animal experts are on hand to evacuate animals in a disaster as mandated by law so that both people and animals can get to safety. Department field enforcement staff worked around the clock during the 2025 Los Angeles firestorms to assist individuals and animals impacted by that disaster.

Animal Care Technicians and other shelter management staff are responsible for providing continuous care for the animals in-shelter including cleaning, feeding, providing enrichment, and assisting with medical procedures/vaccinations. Animal care shelter staff are also responsible for providing assistance to customers seeking to adopt/foster/rescue any of the animals in our facilities. Staff currently provide care at all six shelter locations, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, including holidays.

The Department's medical team evaluates all animals entering each Animal Services Center. They provide preventative veterinary services to all dogs and cats. Both the Veterinarians and Registered Veterinary Technicians implant microchips into dogs, cats, and rabbits. The team facilitates the sterilization of shelter animals through on-site and off-site clinics and Veterinarians. They examine

and process animals held during animal cruelty cases and testify on animals' conditions in court. Our medical team also has the difficult task of relieving the irremediable suffering of animals.

Administrative Clerks assigned to the various Animal Services Centers conduct a number of in-shelter clerical and customer service-related tasks such as processing adoption and foster transactions as well as licensing. These clerical positions are responsible for responding to an overwhelming number of incoming phone calls assisting customers with a variety of issues, requests and demands.

The Department's Administrative Division provides an array of services in support of the Department's primary mission and goals. These support services include the development and implementation of various public relations, marketing, and communication initiatives, informing the community and media organizations about Department activities and encouraging community engagement, processing payroll for Department staff, administering various sterilization programs, providing systems and information technology support, processing new and renewal licensing applications, conducting administrative hearings, procurement, contract administration, accounts receivable, accounts payable and budget oversight.

Proposed FY 2025-26 Budget

The Department currently has an allocation of 328 regular position authorities and 50 resolution authorities, for a total of 378 positions. The Mayor's Proposed FY 2025-26 Budget proposes the elimination of 57 currently filled regular authority positions, 31 vacant regular position authorities, five filled resolution authorities, and 29 vacant resolution authority positions. These proposed eliminations would reduce Department staff by approximately one-third of its total positions.

As proposed, this budget would require the Department to implement layoffs for 62 employees:

- 35 Animal Care Technicians
- 12 Animal Control Officers
- Four Administrative Clerks
- Four Veterinary Technicians
- Two Animal Care Technician Supervisors
- Two Senior Animal Control Officer I
- One Senior Administrative Clerk
- One Public Relations Specialist II
- One Public Information Director I

In addition, the Department would eliminate 60 vacant positions including Animal Care Technician, Animal Control Officer, clerical, payroll, and Veterinarian positions.

The Proposed Budget also reduces Department expense accounts by over \$300,000, including the Animal Medical Supplies Account and the Animal Food/Feed and Grain Account. There would also be a decrease in the Contractual Services Account, reducing the funding for the Department's three-year Canine Enrichment Services agreement to provide approximately six months of services instead of a full year.

Anticipated Impacts

It has been stated publicly numerous times that even with the current level of staffing that the Department is not appropriately staffed to operate six Animal Services Centers. Even if fully staffed, it has been thought that we would only have sufficient staffing to operate four shelter locations. With the number of positions proposed to be eliminated, the Department would need to close at least three shelters. The Department would close the Harbor, West Los Angeles, and West Valley locations. This

would leave the City's three largest animal shelter facilities open for operation (South Los Angeles, North Central and East Valley).

The need for services in those communities with closed facilities would not cease. We are certain that animal intake from these communities will continue. Closing these three locations would mean that individuals who reside in communities close to the closed facilities would need to be rerouted to the open facilities, which is inconvenient and could cause a hardship, especially for those residents without transportation and experiencing other financial hardships. It is also likely that the three remaining facilities will quickly run out of space to maintain animals. This would require the Department to revert back to old procedures for euthanizing animals to continually make room for animals entering the shelters. The number of euthanasia will increase dramatically.

The facility closures will also result in longer Animal Control Officer response times for those residents that live closest to the Harbor, West Los Angeles, and West Valley locations. Depending on the time of day, it can prove difficult to get to some areas due to high traffic. This is especially problematic for emergency calls. Calls for assistance from the Los Angeles Police Department (which has already complained about Department response times due to low staffing) can be delayed by up to three hours.

Closing the West Los Angeles location will result in the need to terminate the agreement the Department currently has with the City of Beverly Hills to provide animal control, enforcement, and care services. Revenues generated for the City through this agreement for the last three years are as follows: \$398,100.34 (2022); \$324,957 (2023); \$360,750 (2024).

With the elimination of the Public Relations team, the Department will lose its ability to conduct effective community outreach and engagement. Our Public Relations team updates and maintains the Department's website and social media presence. They are also the primary contacts for all media outlets and conduct all of our weekly media appearances spotlighting animals for adoption and notifying the masses of various adoption, microchipping, licensing and sterilization community events. Losing the expertise and efforts of this team will almost completely eliminate the Department's ability to promote services and provide public outreach and education.

The elimination of clerical support throughout the Department will cause significant delays for most services the Department provides: adoption/foster transactions, payroll processing, licensing, answering phone calls, and processing CPRA/FOIA requests.

Department Recommendations

The Mayor's proposed budget reflects a \$4,837,152 decrease in the Department's operating budget. However, there is also a proposed \$5,000,000 allocated in the City's Unappropriated Balance (Unappropriated Balance, Animal Services Operations), as well as \$1,482,228 in funding allocated as One-Time Salary For Eliminated Filled Positions. The Department recommends utilizing these funds to retain all of the proposed eliminated filled and vacant positions as well as restoring funding to the Department's other expense and contractual services accounts.

This would allow the Department to maintain the current level of services for the residents of the City of Los Angeles.

Conclusion

The Department does not recommend any budget reduction that will result in the dilution of public safety, the closures of Animal Care Centers, or the increase of the euthanasia rate. Again, we appreciate the Committee's and the Council's continued support and consideration of what the Department addressed and recommended above. We remain committed to our mission and will support the ultimate decisions of the City's policy-makers.




