Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (McOsker - Price):

- 1. INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD), with assistance from the City Attorney and City Administrative Officer (CAO) to prepare and release a new Request for Proposals (RFP) for routine hazardous waste management services at the City's Fire Stations. This RFP should be based on previous solicitations for these services, but also include the following additional requirements for proposers to provide:
 - a. A full list of the proposer's worker and environmental safety records, including injuries or other health and safety matters that have arisen in jobs completed in the City.
 - b. An outline of the available grievance procedure for employees of the proposer company.
 - c. A comprehensive work history list of any job for which the proposer has been removed for failure to complete work satisfactorily.
 - d. A list of work complaints received from customers, within the last five (5) years, and list the names of customers.
 - A list of any lawsuits or claims against the company within the last five (5) years, including
 any registered violations with the State's Department of Toxic Substances Control.
- 2. REQUEST that this solicitation be completed, and a new contract awarded and in place, by June 30, 2026.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer (CAO) nor the CLA has completed a financial analysis of this report.
