

MOTION

Last week, Los Angeles became the focus of intense federal immigration enforcement following a series of large-scale ICE raids. Beginning on June 6, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents conducted coordinated operations targeting multiple locations in neighborhoods including the Fashion District, Westlake, and South Los Angeles. The raids focused on workplaces such as Home Depot and clothing wholesalers, resulting in the detention of dozens of workers. The operations were marked by the use of stun grenades and flash-bang devices, escalating tensions on the ground.

The immediate impact of the ICE raids triggered widespread protests across various parts of the city, and while the majority of protests have been peaceful, there have also been reports of vandalism, arson, and looting. Demonstrators gathered in significant numbers, expressing outrage at what they described as aggressive and inhumane immigration tactics. The protests quickly escalated, with clashes between law enforcement and demonstrators.

Though it is still early to assess the full scope of the situation and it remains dynamic, it is critical that the Los Angeles Police Department conduct a thorough after-action review of the incidents.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Chief of Police TRANSMIT the formal after-action report detailing the events leading up to, and the Police Department's response during the protests that occurred in response to federal immigration enforcement raids. This after-action report should include an analysis of all use-of-force incidents.
