## MOTION

Council District 14 has seen a large number of demonstrations and actions in Downtown Los Angeles, some of which have led to significant impact on its neighborhoods, including on its residents and small businesses. Various needs have arisen, from facade repairs to fortification measures, as well as graffiti removal from both private and public property.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council determine, as provided in section 54954.2(b)(2) of the Government Code, and pursuant to **Rule 23** of the Rules of the City Council, that there is a need to take immediate action on this matter AND that the need for immediate action came to the attention of the City subsequent to the posting of the agenda on Friday, June 6, 2025 for today's Council meeting.

I FURTHER MOVE that the City Administrative Officer (CAO), the Economic and Workforce Development Department (EWDD), and the Community Investment for Families Department (CIFD) report within 3 days on City our outside funds eligible to be utilized for assistance programs for communities impacted by civil disturbance, and specifically those communities' local small businesses. The report should include guidance on the various mechanisms by which funding can be distributed, including but not limited to grants, reimbursements, and direct cash assistance, and the use of the Source Center system.

I FURTHER MOVE that the CAO and the Office of Community Beautification (OCB) report within 3 days with recommendations to increase funding for graffiti removal and prioritize areas impacted by civil disturbance for service. This report should include an analysis of the applicability of all funds intended for public safety.
