## MOTION

Following the January wildfires, a state of emergency was declared to enable access to state and federal resources and to expedite the procurement of resources necessary for recovery efforts. In response, the City has entered into two no-bid contracts with Hagerty Consulting and AECOM. The contracts were awarded without a public process, and at this time, the specific roles and responsibilities of each contractor remain unclear. The funding sources for these contracts has not been identified, nor has the scope of work for the expected work product.


As the legislative body of the City of Los Angeles, the City Council should be privy to how public resources are being used and what services are provided in return. This information is essential to ensure that future budgetary decisions are informed and that the City can build greater internal capacity to manage disaster aid and recovery.

The Mayor's Office, in partnership with the Emergency Management Department, has been overseeing the contract work with Hagerty Consulting and AECOM, and it is imperative that they collaborate with the City Administrative Officer and Chief Legislative Analyst to provide basic details regarding these contracts.

I THEREFORE MOVE that Chief Legislative Analyst, in coordination with the City Administrative Officer and the Emergency Management Department, report back to the City Council on the following details for both the Hagerty Consulting and the AECOM contracts:

- Names and resumes of employees assigned;
- Hours billed to date;
- Payments made along with source of funds;
- Scope of work; and
- Timeline for service delivery.
