CIVIL RIGHTS, EQUITY, IMMIGRATION AGING AND DISABILITY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to maximize any fines and fees associated with impersonating a federal, state, or local law enforcement agent, to intimidate or harass, threaten individual persons or property, or any other method that could be used by an individual to coerce a person or persons under the false pretense of being a public safety officer.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Blumenfield, Hernandez - McOsker):

- REQUEST the City Attorney to report to Council with options that update and amend relevant sections of the LAMC in order to maximize any fines and fees associated with impersonating a federal, state, or local law enforcement agent, to intimidate or harass, threaten individual persons or property, or any other method that could be used by an individual to coerce a person or persons under the false pretense of being a public safety officer.
- 2. REQUEST the City Attorney to report to Council on the ability for the City to affirm a resident's right to request verifiable identification and legal authority during any detainment, search, or enforcement action, especially in any instance involving non-uniformed or unmarked individuals.
