A Neighborhood Council Community Impact Statement (CIS) has been successfully submitted to your Commission or City Council. We provided information below about CISs and attached a copy of the CIS.

We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: The Sherman Oaks Neighborhood Council (SONC) supports City Council's motion that seeks to support LGBTQ+ Angelinos* in light of ongoing federal rollbacks that target this community. As a result of minority scapegoating, a manufactured culture war, and willful disregard of science and academia that has led to a hateful, bigoted, and discriminatory atmosphere in this country, many LGBTQ+ individuals face challenges accessing healthcare, housing or shelter, and other vital services. The Lemkin Institute, founded to make sure the atrocities of the Holocaust never happen again, issued a "Red Flag Alert for Genocide" specifically in regard to laws and actions in the United States targeting

transgender people. It is imperative the City act to protect this vulnerable minority group which is under attack through discriminatory legislation and unlawful executive actions. *As stated in a prior motion, SONC also requests City Council use one initialism for this community—terms LGBT, LGBTQ+, LGBTQI+, and LGBTQIA+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, and Acesexual) all appear in the Council File Management System to describe this population, which hinders searchability when requesting past and present council motions. The plus-sign is meant to include all applicable identities; standardizing this initialism will increase efficiency and accuracy. For the purpose of this motion, SONC uses “LGBTQ+” for this community.
