Summary of Comments from Local 11

1. Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) Assessment is Flawed

- Assumptions were inaccurate
 - Consideration of Ferris Wheel and Amusement Attractions as Ancillary Uses and Parking Lot Impacts
 - Use of Comparable Venues
 - Air Quality (AQ) and Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions were Underestimated
 - Transportation Demand Management Strategies Inadequate
- 2. Lack of Enforceability for Greenhouse Gas Emissions Project Feature
- 3. Lack of notification regarding BHC Meeting




VMT Assessment

 Consideration of Ferris Wheel and Amusement Attractions as Ancillary Uses and Parking Lot Impacts

Response:

- These Project components are expected to be ancillary to the Amphitheater and adjacent retail uses
 - Not expected to generate new vehicle trips (nor VMT)
- The anticipated peak day demand will be met by available parking prior to development of the 208 E. 22nd Street Lot
 - Intended to serve the greater San Pedro Waterfront area





PARKING PLAN

- Parking
 - Green lots Premium
 - 1,660 spaces
 - Blue lots General
 - 3,586 spaces
- Parking would be adequate to serve peak day estimates prior to development of 208 E. 22nd Street lot



VMT Assessment

Improper Selection of Comparable Venues

Response:

- The Greek Theater and City Grove of Anaheim were selected from the four regional options to provide Project level VMT
 - Greek Theater was operated by Nederlander, suggesting similar variety of events
 - City Grove of Anaheim represents a similar population density



VMT Assessment

Longer Average Trip Length increases AQ and GHG impacts

Response:

 An increase in criteria pollutants based on the longer (19.3 mile) average trip length would still not exceed thresholds to be considered a significant impact



VMT Assessment

 Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Strategies Including California Air Pollution Control Officers Association (CAPCOA) TDM Strategies were not included

Response:

 All TDM strategies including CAPCOA TDM Strategies were considered, and reasonable and appropriate TDM strategies were incorporated into the document (MM-TRAN-1)

- Provide End-of-Trip Bicycle Facilities
- Traveler Information and Wayfinding
- Priority Parking Spaces for Electric and Clean Air Vehicles

 Enforcement mechanisms were appropriately included in the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP)
