SECOND AMENDED AND RESTATED AGREEMENT WITH AEON NEXUS (CONTRACT NO. C-140561) FOR REPLATFORMING OF CRIMINAL CASE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (EXTENDING AGREEMENT BY ONE YEAR WITH NO CONTRACT CEILING INCREASE)

Honorable Members:

The Office of the City Attorney requests, pursuant to Section 10.5 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code, the authority to enter into the attached Second Amended and Restated Agreement (Amended Agreement) with Aeon Nexus Corporation (Aeon), which would extend the current three-year contract by one year. The additional year is necessary to allow Aeon and the City Attorney to complete the ongoing replacement of the Criminal Case Management System (CCMS) with a new database and the development of a race blind filing technology solution that will be needed to comply with California law. The Amended Agreement does not provide for any increase in the contract's funding amount, as the existing amount is anticipated to be sufficient to complete the project.

Aeon's proposal was selected following a request for proposals seeking a vendor to provide a new technology solution to replace the City's aging CCMS, which relies on legacy software platforms, and to provide a new platform with greater functionality, reliability, efficiency, and integration capabilities. The City Attorney and Aeon entered



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into the original contract effective June 23, 2022, with a term of three years and a not to exceed amount of \$4,900,850. In August 2024, the parties entered into a First Amended and Restated Agreement, which added the development of a race-blind filing solution (Race Blind Solution) to the scope of work – in order to comply with Assembly Bill 2778 – and \$154,012.50 in funding to implement the Race Blind Solution.

If approved, the Amended Agreement will extend the expiration date of the agreement to June 22, 2026, replace Standard Provisions for City Contracts (6/24 v.1) with the most current version of that document, and make other minor revisions. The contract's not to exceed amount will remain \$5,054,862.50, the expenditure of which is subject to the availability of budgeted funds.
