A Neighborhood Council Community Impact Statement (CIS) has been successfully submitted to your Commission or City Council. We provided information below about CISs and attached a copy of the CIS.

We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

We share this information to assist you with the docketing neighborhood council items before your board/commission. If you have questions and/or concerns, please contact the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at empowerla@lacity.org.

We declare that on date, a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held by the Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council (ERNC) at which a quorum was present. By a vote of 13 Ayes, 9 Nos insert vote count, the ERNC adopted the following Community Impact Statement concerning Council File 25-1035 hyperlinked to CF:

Federal immigration enforcement actions in Los Angeles have led to numerous reports of civil and constitutional rights violations. Many individuals, especially immigrants, lack a safe or accessible way to document these abuses. Creating an online intake system would provide a secure platform for impacted individuals and witnesses to submit testimony, which could support legal actions and help prevent further harm. This would be a resource for families who do not have information on their detained loved ones during this process.

The Eagle Rock Neighborhood Council Housing and Homelessness Committee supports Council File 25-1035: Online Intake System / Federal Immigration Enforcement Actions / Violations of Civil and Constitutional Rights, to ensure accountability and uphold the rights of all residents in our city.

We support the City Attorney and the Community Investment for Families Department, to report in 30 days on the feasibility of establishing an online intake system to collect personal testimony, written or recorded, from impacted individuals or witnesses of federal immigration enforcement actions in the City, to potentially be used in court actions in response to violations of civil and constitutional rights and temporary restraining orders.
