

GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS and BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEES' REPORT and ORDINANCES FIRST CONSIDERATION relative to amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) concerning the City's commercial cannabis record refiling and renewal requirements.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

PRESENT and ADOPT the accompanying three Ordinances dated May 19, 2026:

- a. An Ordinance amending Section 104.12 of Article 4, Chapter X of the LAMC regarding processes at the Department of Cannabis Regulation (DCR) and regulation of Commercial Cannabis Activity.
- b. An Ordinance amending Section 104.12 of Article 4, Chapter X of the LAMC regarding processes at the DCR and regulation of Commercial Cannabis Activity to include renewal periods and reinstatement.
- c. An Ordinance amending Section 104.12 of Article 4, Chapter X of the LAMC regarding the refiling of applications to conduct Commercial Cannabis Activity.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the City Attorney. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:

On June 2, 2026, the Government Operations (GO) Committee considered three City Attorney reports dated June 20, 2026 along with three accompanying Ordinances relative to amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) concerning the City's commercial cannabis record refiling and renewal requirements. These Ordinances are in response to Council action on April 20, 2026. Specifically each Ordinance covers:

- a. Amending Section 104.12 of Article 4, Chapter X of the LAMC regarding processes at the Department of Cannabis Regulation (DCR) and regulation of Commercial Cannabis Activity.
- b. Amending Section 104.12 of Article 4, Chapter X of the LAMC regarding processes at the DCR and regulation of Commercial Cannabis Activity to include renewal periods and reinstatement.
- c. Amending Section 104.12 of Article 4, Chapter X of the LAMC regarding the refiling of applications to conduct Commercial Cannabis Activity.

After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the GO Committee moved to recommend approval of the three Ordinances. Subsequently, on June 16, the Budget and Finance Committee also considered this item. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to concur with the GO Committee. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
