PLANNING AND LAND USE MANAGEMENT (PLUM) COMMITTEE REPORT relative to requesting an ordinance to make it a trespass to leave designated trails, walkways, or recreation areas and enter into designated Protected Areas for Wildlife at Ken Malloy Harbor Regional Park without authorization; and related matters.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (McOsker – Park):

- REQUEST the City Attorney, with the assistance of the Department of Recreation and Parks, to prepare and present an ordinance to make it a trespass to leave designated trails, walkways, or recreation areas and enter into designated Protected Areas for Wildlife at Ken Malloy Harbor Regional Park without authorization.
- 2. INSTRUCT the Department of City Planning (DCP) and request the City Attorney to report with recommendations for implementing further protections of the sensitive biological resources at Ken Malloy Harbor Regional Park and the Harbor City Waterway, including designating both as Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Areas as prescribed under the California Coastal Act.
- 3. REQUEST the City Attorney, with assistance of the Department of Recreation and Parks, DCP, and any other department needed, to report prior to the preparation of the ordinance, within 30 days, on existing protection for parks, sensitive areas, protected areas, and wilderness areas in the City of Los Angeles.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the Chief Legislative Analyst nor the CAO has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:

At its regular meeting held on October 14, 2025, the PLUM Committee considered Motion (McOsker – Park) relative to requesting an ordinance to make it a trespass to leave designated trails, walkways, or recreation areas and enter into designated Protected Areas for Wildlife at Ken Malloy Harbor Regional Park without authorization; and related matters. Councilmember Raman provided an amendment on reporting back within 30 days on existing protection for wilderness areas in the City of Los Angeles. After an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to approve the Motion as amended, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
