## RECOMMENDED ACTION

- That the Board of Police Commissioners REVIEW and APPROVE the donation of 200 surplus ballistic helmets from the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department; and,
- 2. That the Board of Police Commissioners TRANSMIT this request to the Los Angeles City Council.

## DISCUSSION

It is requested that 200 used surplus ballistic helmets be donated to the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department, 90 Justice Center Drive, Crossville, TN 38555. Upon receipt, the Sheriff's Department will assume responsibility of the equipment for use by their personnel.

The surplus helmets have exceeded the manufacturer's five-year warranty and are currently awaiting destruction. The equipment has no value to the LAPD. The helmets are stored on pallets and all the pallets are ready for immediate shipping.

The Cumberland Sheriff's Department has agreed to the terms of the donation, which includes a liability waiver holding the LAPD and the City of Los Angeles harmless for any injuries and/or deaths that might occur as a result of the use of the donated helmets.
