I live in CD 13 and walk to Dodger Stadium. I'm a life long Dodger fan. I've taken the Dodger Express Shuttle from Union Station numerous times when I lived Downtown. Councilmembers Hernandez, Jurado, and Soto-Martinez represent the communities that would be impacted the most by this project: CD1, CD13, and CD14. I would be impacted by this project, but not as much as the neighbors who would live underneath or right near its path. Their communities are opposed to the gondola. That includes me and many of my neighbors. I have not met and do not know of any of my neighbors who support the Gondola. These local elected officials, those closest to their communities, who best represent them, are opposed to the gondola. I urge you to defer to their judgment of what is best for their constituents in their districts.
