Comments for Public Posting: I fully SUPPORT Councilmember Hernandez's resolution and OPPOSE the LA ART Gondola. As a CD1 resident and car-free Metro rider, I am deeply concerned about the impacts of the Gondola towers and stations on the existing Metro A Line. The Alpine Tower looks impossibly close to the A Line tracks, yet there was no mention of the Gondola's impact on the A Line, whether during construction or long-term, in the EIR. This is unacceptable, as the A Line, unlike the Gondola, represents true public transit that serves Angelenos. I am also concerned about the impact on Olvera Street, which is not only an important part of DTLA and Chinatown history and a tourist destination, but has served as a community hub during ICE raids and related protests. Residents of CD1, CD13 and CD14 want and deserve better car-free access to Dodger Stadium, but through means such as upgraded pedestrian access with adequate solar street lighting, dedicated bus lanes, improved buses (Dodger Stadium Express, LADOT DASH, and/or Metro), and increased A Line service. If Frank McCourt and LA ART want to fund these improvements to invest in our city, I would welcome that! But it is increasingly apparent, through what has been studied and what is notably omitted from study, that the Gondola will not serve the public transit needs of Angelenos and will only worsen the public transit we do have
