I am in SUPPORT of Item #48: to pass this City Resolution against the LA ART gondola and order Metro to strike down the Supplemental EIR. Earlier this year, the California State Appellate Court ordered the gondola's original EIR to be decertified, showing how flawed and hasty LA ART's conduct has been. The current Draft SEIR is more of the same: LA ART's solution for noise mitigation is forcing renters to keep their windows closed at all times, sacrificing access to fresh air and forcing use of air conditioning and a rise in utility bill costs.
