Comments for Public Posting: I support this motion to revoke the permit issued to build the concrete wall at 4311 Lincoln Blvd. For decades now, residents have enjoyed coastal access from surrounding communities on bike and on foot - that access has now been taken away suddenly, selfishly without appropriate public or civic input. A minority of people living here, and on the HOA board in the towers appear to believe that only they may have easy access between Burke Park, and the land east of it. Most in the community are against the concrete wall, and would prefer to have safe access and travel restored. Having spoken with people at the adjoining Ralphs, I know that foot traffic into the store is down since the wall was put up. I'd imagine the same is true of the shops on the marina. I also know that the adjoining preschool has had their trips to Lloyd Taber library curtailed by having their access cut off. Several seniors have also mentioned dismay at the wall being put up, and forcing them to walk around to Lincoln, instead of taking the path they've known for decades living here. Bikers have been forced to take Lincoln, which is not the best route with its high traffic and high traffic speeds, not to mention the obstruction on the sidewalk next to Ralphs. I hope you'll vote to restore one reason why so many residents, near and far, enjoy the neighborhood: its walkability and bikeability.
