Comments for Public Posting: JCI is a menace to our neighborhood. Not only are they the largest JCI facility in the country but it is the only one that is not enclosed and does not have an emergency response team. They have had 3 "accidents" in the last 3 months 1 of which was a spill. Was the neighborhood notified? NO. They don't have a mechanism in place to alert the neighborhood to shelter in place. They don't have a structure to contain the chlorine gas. What if there was a chlorine gas release from a tanker? Closing our doors and windows isn't enough, we'll all be dead. We need someone to put the safety of the residents ahead of the wants and needs of a negligent business operating out of a 1940's built shanty with rusted tin panels as the roof structure and roads that collapse under the weight of a truck. JCI needs to leave our community or at the very least be enclosed to keep the chlorine gas release contained. There is a Boys and Girls Club next door, their trucks exit 15 feet from the club and have to make a sharp left turn off the dirt road to drive through the adjacent neighborhood. What spills out of their facility travels through the storm drains directly to waterways that empty into the San Pedro Harbor.
