REQUEST FOR 41.18 LAMC ZONES, TO ADDRESS CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES DETRIMENTAL TO PUBLIC WELFARE OR PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ISSUES

Dear Ms. Hutt:

I am writing to respectfully request the installation of Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 41.18 signage in the vicinity of the below listed locations due to growing concerns regarding public safety and the recent increase in homeless encampments and associated criminal activity in the area.

Residents and business owners in the neighborhood have contacted the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) after observing a noticeable rise in unlawful activities, including theft, trespassing, and disturbances, which have directly impacted the sense of security and overall quality of life in our community. The presence of encampments has also raised concerns about sanitation, fire hazards, and the well-being of both housed and unhoused individuals.
