

RULES, ELECTIONS AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to establishing the City's position on Senate Bill (SB) 1292 (Richardson), which would allow local governments to establish enhanced curb management systems to record images of vehicles.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Hutt – Hernandez), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

RESOLVE to include in the City's 2025-26 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for SB 1292 (Richardson), which would allow local governments to implement enhanced curb management systems to enforce parking violations provided standards are met for accuracy, data retention, and the secure handling of driver information.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On April 17, 2026, your Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered an April 16, 2026 CLA report and a March 24, 2026 Resolution (Hutt – Hernandez), relative to establishing the City's position on SB 1292 (Richardson), which would allow local governments to establish enhanced curb management systems to record images of vehicles. According to the Resolution, the implementation of enhanced curbside management systems would help supplement scarce City resources by using technology to detect and process parking violations, thereby ensuring better compliance with parking restrictions. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the Resolution. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
