WHEREAS, throughout his tenure with the City, Mr. Meyers has demonstrated exceptional technical expertise and leadership in the field of solid waste management, with experience spanning landfill design, regulatory compliance, and the management of the City's Household Hazardous Waste collection program, ensuring the safe and responsible handling of materials critical to public health and environmental protection; and


