SON HEUNG-MIN

WHEREAS, Son Heung-min is widely regarded as one of the most talented and popular Asian players in the history of professional football, and has inspired millions around the world through his skill, leadership, and sportsmanship; and

WHEREAS, Son Heung-min's distinguished club career includes early success in Germany with Hamburger SV and Bayer 04 Leverkusen, before rising to global prominence with Tottenham Hotspur, where he was twice named Player of the Year, selected to the PFA Team of the Year, and helped lead the club to the 2019 UEFA Champions League Final; and

WHEREAS, his remarkable solo goal against Burnley on December 7, 2019, earned the prestigious FIFA Puskás Award, recognizing the most beautiful goal scored worldwide that year; and

WHEREAS, Son later assumed the captaincy of Tottenham Hotspur in 2023 and led the club to the 2025 UEFA Europa League title, securing its first major trophy in 17 years; and

WHEREAS, on the international stage, Son has been a cornerstone of South Korean football, leading his nation to a gold medal at the 2018 Asian Games and solidifying his legacy as one of the country's all-time leading scorers; and

WHEREAS, as captain of the South Korea national football team, Son has earned more than 130 international caps, scored over 50 goals, and represented his country in three FIFA World Cup tournaments and multiple Asian Cup competitions; and

WHEREAS, Son Heung-min joined Los Angeles Football Club following an extraordinary 10-year tenure with Tottenham Hotspur in the Premier League, where he scored 173 goals across all competitions, recorded 101 assists, and became the first Asian player to win the Premier League Golden Boot during the 2021–22 season; and

WHEREAS, Son now joins a distinguished group of global football stars who have brought their talents to Los Angeles, including Carlos Vela, Giorgio Chiellini, Olivier Giroud, Gareth Bale, and Hugo Lloris; and

WHEREAS, a native of Chuncheon, South Korea, Son Heung-min's journey from a young player in the Bundesliga to an international icon reflects dedication, perseverance, and excellence both on and off the field.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Los Angeles hereby and recognizes Son Heung-min's outstanding achievements, global impact on the sport of football, and the inspiration he provides to diverse communities throughout the City; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council celebrates Son Heung-min's contributions to the game and looks forward to his continued success with the Los Angeles Football Club and his positive impact on the City of Los Angeles.

WHEREAS, public works professionals focus on infrastructure, facilities, and services that are of vital importance to sustainable and resilient communities, and to the public health, safety, high quality of life, and well-being of the people of the City of Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, these essential infrastructure systems and services could not be provided without the dedicated efforts of public works professionals, who are employees at all levels of government and in the private sector, and who are responsible for the design, construction, operation, and maintenance of transportation systems, water supply and treatment, stormwater management, solid waste services, public buildings, and other critical facilities that support daily life; and

WHEREAS, public works professionals play a key role in advancing environmental stewardship, climate resilience, emergency response, and the efficient use of public resources, ensuring that communities are prepared for current and future challenges; and

WHEREAS, public works professionals demonstrate a high level of commitment, skill, and professionalism in carrying out their duties, often working behind the scenes and under challenging conditions to ensure the safety and functionality of the City’s infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest for residents of the City of Los Angeles to gain knowledge of, and maintain an ongoing interest in, the importance of public works services and programs, and to recognize the essential contributions of those who deliver them; and

WHEREAS, the year 2026 marks the 66th annual National Public Works Week, sponsored by the American Public Works Association, which seeks to raise awareness about the contributions of public works professionals and to inspire future generations to pursue careers in the field; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Los Angeles does hereby declare the week of May 17, 2026 to May 23, 2026, as National Public Works Week, encourages all residents to recognize and celebrate the vital role of public works in their daily lives, and to participate in activities, events, and ceremonies that honor the dedication and achievements of public works professionals, whose work protects public health, ensures public safety, and enhances the quality of life for all.

NANCY HELEN SUTLEY

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Nancy Helen Sutley was born and raised in Queens, New York, and is a proud graduate of the Bronx High School of Science; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley holds a master of public policy from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University and a Bachelor of Arts degree in government from Cornell University; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley served as the Policy Director for the National Independent Energy Producers and as an Industry Economist for the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley served as a senior policy advisor to the San Francisco regional administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency and as special assistant to U.S. EPA administrator Carol Browner during the Clinton Administration. She also served as a member of Hillary Clinton's Southern California LGBTQ steering committee; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley served at the California Environmental Protection Agency as deputy secretary for policy and intergovernmental relations from 1999 to 2003, where she also was the top energy advisor to then Governor Gray Davis. During this period, she supported a requirement for the City of Los Angeles to produce 20 percent of its power from renewable sources; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley was appointed by then Governor Gray Davis to serve on the California State Water Resources Control Board from 2003 to 2005. During this period, she advised and decided on water quality standards, water rights issues, and policies to protect water resources; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley served as deputy mayor for Energy and Environment in Los Angeles under former Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa. During this period, Deputy Mayor Sutley was also appointed to serve on the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California Board from 2006 to 2009; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley was appointed as chair of the Council of Environmental Quality in January 2009 by former President Barack Obama. During this period, she promoted water and energy efficiency in the White House, including leading plans to install solar panels,

solar hot water heaters, low-flush toilets, and sensors that automatically turn off lights in unused areas. She also spearheaded President Obama's 2013 Climate Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley returned to the city of Los Angeles in 2014, appointed as the Chief Sustainability and Economic Development Officer for the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP), where she initiated corporate sustainability programs, spearheaded LADWP's LaKretz Innovation Campus, promoted the electrification of the transportation network, and coordinated the Clean Grid LA plan; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley was appointed by former Mayor Eric Garcetti to serve on the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California Board representing the City of Los Angeles; and


WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley returned to Los Angeles City Hall in 2023 to serve as the Deputy Mayor of Energy and Sustainability under Mayor Karen Bass. During this period, she completed the Mayor's Climate Implementation Plan; and

WHEREAS, Deputy Mayor Sutley is currently the Vice Chair of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California Board; and

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles City Council commends Deputy Mayor Sutley for her long standing achievements in environmental stewardship and sustainability for the city, state, and nation;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Los Angeles City Council by adoption of this resolution congratulates Deputy Mayor Sutley for 15 years of loyal and dedicated service to the City of Los Angeles. On behalf of the people of Los Angeles, best wishes are extended to Deputy Mayor Sutley and family for a long, happy, and rewarding retirement.
