We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

We share this information to assist you with the docketing neighborhood council items before your board/commission. If you have questions and/or concerns, please contact the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at empowerla@lacity.org.

To the Los Angeles City Council:

The Watts Neighborhood Council respectfully submits this Community Impact Statement in support of Council File 26-0008-S10 regarding oversized vehicle parking restrictions.

Residents throughout Watts frequently express concerns regarding traffic safety, visibility, emergency access, sanitation issues, illegal dumping, and parking availability in residential neighborhoods. Oversized vehicles parked for extended periods can create hazardous conditions for motorists, pedestrians, bicyclists, and emergency responders.

Public safety and neighborhood quality of life are critical priorities for our community. Residents deserve safe and accessible streets that support mobility, visibility, and emergency response while preserving neighborhood character.

At the same time, the Watts Neighborhood Council recognizes that some individuals residing in oversized vehicles may be experiencing housing insecurity or homelessness. The City should implement enforcement strategies that are paired with outreach, supportive services, and housing resources whenever possible.

Historically underserved communities should not be forced to choose between public safety and compassion. Effective solutions can accomplish both objectives by addressing immediate concerns while connecting vulnerable individuals to appropriate support systems.

For these reasons, the Watts Neighborhood Council supports Council File 26-0008-S10 and encourages a balanced implementation strategy that promotes safety, equity, and dignity.
