The process has been exhausting and traumatizing. I built my Palisades house in 2012 with my then husband; since then I've divorced and my children are young adults living on their own. This is a great house that a family should be living while enjoying all of the amenities of coastal living. I would like to sell my house and use the proceeds to fund my retirement. After the cost of tearing my house down to the studs and rebuilding after the Palisades Fire, the last thing the City of LA should be doing is penalizing residents like me even more by taking a percentage of our home sales. For so many people their retirement is in the value of their house. It is wrong to take that from them after forcing them to incur the expenses of rebuilding after an unnecessary wildfire.
