

MOTION

The Port of Long Beach has notified the City of Los Angeles that the proposed Goods Movement Training Campus project will not proceed as originally contemplated, as the Port of Long Beach and the Port of Los Angeles were unable to reach an agreement on the framework necessary to advance the project as a joint effort. As a result, the project is no longer proceeding as originally contemplated, and the actions and reporting requests outlined in Council File 25-0364 are no longer applicable.

Given the significant public funding, staff resources, and intergovernmental coordination already dedicated to goods movement workforce development, and recognizing the critical role these efforts will play in supporting the regional economy in the coming years, it is appropriate that the City and the Port remain accountable and transparent regarding how these investments will continue to be advanced.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council request that the Executive Director of the Port of Los Angeles provide a verbal update to the Trade, Travel, and Tourism Committee regarding the current status of the Goods Movement Training Campus and related workforce training efforts, including any alternative plans, funding considerations, independent or collaborative initiatives, and opportunities to continue supporting a world-class goods movement workforce for the region.

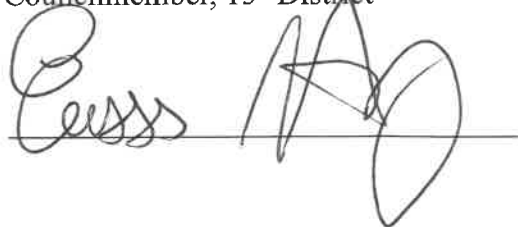
