We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

The Northwest San Pedro Neighborhood Council **supports CF 26-0251.**

Whereas, on February 18, 2026, a fallen power pole caused a full closure of Interstate 110 near Gaffey Street in San Pedro. The response was not efficient and timely. The transportation facility serves the whole harbor area and clearly coordination protocols were not in place. The Northwest San Pedro Neighborhood Council recommendations are as follows:

1. Availability and timely notifications to residents of similar emergency road disruptions.
2. Cal Trans to find a site for local storage for portable changeable signs and other mobile traffic control.
3. We recommend a study be conducted for the installation of permanent electric signs along major arteries throughout the Harbor area.
4. Cal Trans needs to develop better protocols when they coordinate with city and state agencies for all incidents within our city boundaries. We need a quicker emergency response.
5. Develop an effective communication and alert system to notify the community and businesses in Harbor area. LA Notify is not effective in Harbor area.
