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Comments for Public Posting: While the gesture and sentiment of this motion honoring Sergeant Adrian Carrillo is greatly appreciated and should be passed and implemented, there is already Veterans Memorial Square at the intersection of Figueroa Street and York Boulevard in Highland Park. This intersection and pocket park has been known as such since at least 1986 and held several memorial ceremonies over the years. Possibly, the intersection can directly honor Sergeant Adrian Carrillo by naming the intersection "Sergeant Adrian Carrillo Memorial Square". Other alternative options that come to mind include "Arleta Veterans Memorial Square", "San Fernando Valley Veterans Memorial Square", or "East San Fernando Valley Veterans Memorial Square". Of course, there is no doubt that a permanent ceremonial sign should be installed to honor Sergeant Carrillo. Since it is related, I'd like to highlight Highland Park Veterans Memorial Square used to have an old design of permanent ceremonial square signage installed (photo attached below). This sign was removed during 2019 to be replaced with the modern design but it wasn't replaced. I think this is a great opportunity to officially do as such, since Veterans Memorial Square just recently celebrated beautification improvements to the public square and replaced the stolen missing bronze plaques. Permanent ceremonial square signage should be installed at the street level to attract people to the newly renovated Square.
