HOUSING & HOMELESSNESS

Over the past several years, the City has invested in a regional Time Limited Subsidy program (TLS, formerly known as Rapid Rehousing) administered by the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA). TLS is an evidence-based housing intervention that has been funded by a combination of federal, state, and local funding. In October 2024, the Council mandated that LAHSA fully utilize TLS slots by matching individuals living at City-funded interim sites to the program in a timely manner. Thanks to the Council’s intervention, TLS slots were 100% utilized at the end of Fiscal Year 2024-25, with 5,190 adult and family households receiving housing and support through the program as of June 30, 2025¹.

This fiscal year, due to unprecedented federal, state, and local funding reductions, 3,050 adult and family slots within the system are slated to end on June 30, 2026. The City has funded approximately 20% of the total cost to fund these slots with one-time funding (HHAP Round 5).

Over the past eight months, there has been a regional effort to help households in slots with expiring funding transition out of the TLS program and to permanent housing. This effort has made some progress: As of February 1, 2026, 1,200 households have transitioned out of the program this fiscal year, with the majority transitioning to permanent housing. Another 1,660 households are currently supported by TLS funding that is slated to expire on June 30, 2026.

Given that there are still 1,660 households currently supported by the regional TLS program for whom funding will end in June 2026, and given that funding for the slots supporting these households is a combination of State, County, and City, there is a need for the City to understand what can be done before funding expires to help impacted households sustain housing and the implications for the City of expiring funding.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council request LAHSA and instruct the CAO, with the support of the LAHD and HR&A Advisors to report on:


- Progress transitioning households in slots with expiring funding out of the program;
- The projected number of households in City-funded slots who will not be able to successfully exit the program before the end of the fiscal year;
- Recommendations on how to support households who don’t have an exit plan whose slots are expiring; AND
- The projected regional impact of expiring state and federal funding that was awarded directly to LAHSA
