CRC 12: City Council expansion

CRC 22: Rank Choice Voting

CRC 23: Allow City Council by Ordinance to lower the voting age to 16 for City and LAUSD Board elections

CRC 35: Replace matching public funds with public campaign financing language

CRC 40: Include Public Banking provisions in charter

CRC 54: Require LAPD to follow City Council ordinances

CRC 58: Allow the Chief of Police to fire officers with a history of harm / Free Speech & Protest Protections

Motion 26-0638: Resident (noncitizen) voting

Motion: Controller Funding - Allocates 0.42% of City General Fund to Controller
