Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Electric bikes and similar vehicles are proliferating throughout the City. Some bikes travel up to 28 mph. Unfortunately, crashes involving e-bikes have increased. Local authorities report a significant rise in trauma cases, particularly among juvenile riders. The state legislature has introduced a number of bills to increase the safety of these vehicles and protect riders and the public.

This motion asks City agencies to report back within 90 days with (1) recommendations to regulate e-bikes and (2) recommendation regarding pending state bills. It also requests that the police and City Attorney collect data on e-bike collisions, injuries, and deaths to help adjust policies.

This motion is also to be **submitted as a Community Impact Statement (CIS) to Council File 26-0548.**
