

Communication from Public

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Comments for Public Posting: This is a comment for the Los Angeles Special Meeting being held on Monday, June 15 2026 at 1:00p. I am writing to express the anger and disappointment of my city from the police killing of a 2 year old on June 13 2026. Jameson was a beloved 2 year old family member who was joyously celebrating the Knicks' win in Los Angeles on June 13 with his family. A wellness check on an excited celebration had turned into a violent killing when Jameson's happiness, energy, and wagging tail was misinterpreted by police employee as life-threatening. Jameson was a beloved family dog and, as they are, happy family member full of life, spirit, and love. This killing, and now-broken family, raises critical questions regarding proper use of force, employee training, and accountability when enforcing policy compliance on citizens: - Whether current LAPD policies adequately address encounters during wellness checks and whether death was truly the only option available; - Whether armed employees receive sufficient training in de-escalation techniques, behavioral assessments, and options which don't involve the death of energetic and excited family members; - And whether the investigation of the circumstances surrounding this innocent death are thorough, timely, and transparent as Los Angeles deserves. I'm urging Los Angeles City Council to: - Demand a full, public report on the killing of 2 year old Jameson from LAPD and Board of Police Commissioners; - Review and strengthen policies regarding use of force, particularly during celebratory wellness checks or checks during national celebrations; - Ensure armed police employees carry and are trained to use alternatives to death, such as pepper-spray. - Consider mandatory compensation protocols for families when their members are wrongfully killed by armed city employees enforcing public policy. What was possibly the happiest member of a family was stolen from this earth during a time of celebration and happiness by those expected to protect. A neighbor now carries guilt for having requested policy help from their city. This outcome was preventable and is not being accepted by our city's citizens. Please look at Jameson in the attached .PDF and try to resolve the violence he received for yourself.
