MOTION

Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 14.6(a) authorizes General Managers to submit applications for competitive and/or discretionary grants without Mayor and Council approval if no City General Funds, matching funds or commitments of City resources required. Departments must also provide written notice to the Mayor, City Administrative Officer and Council when applying for these Grants.

Recently, the California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) updated its policies relative to grant applications to require written proof of authority by the Governing Body naming an Authorized Agent to inter into Subrecipient agreements for Cal OES programs when submitting an application for grant funds. The Police Department (LAPD) regularly applies for two grants from Cal OES, the Internet Crimes Against Children (IC) and the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement (CQ) Programs, which do not require a General Fund match. In order to meet this new requirement from Cal OES, and enable LAPD to compete for these grant funds in a timely manner, Council must authorize the Chief of Police to enter into Grant Awards and/or Subaward Agreements on behalf of the City with Cal OES for the IC and CQ programs.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police, or designee, to enter into a Grant Award and/or Subaward Agreement for the City of Los Angeles for the California Office of Emergency Services' (Cal OES) Internet Crimes Against Children (IC) and Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement (CQ) Programs, in accordance with Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 14.6(a). This action would not impact requirements for Council approval of the acceptance of grant funds.
