

MOTION

The City regularly recognizes the history and culture of its residents and numerous neighborhoods through the installation of ceremonial signage that commemorate both individuals' and communities' legacies alike and serve as an important function of placemaking for visitors and residents.

In recent years, the City has recognized numerous individuals from the neighborhood of Pacoima who have left a lasting mark on this City from Reverend Dr. Jefferey Joseph Sr., a revered faith leader and civil rights advocate (C.F. 26-0636) to educators like Dr. Yvonne Chan (C.F. 25-1478) and Anita Zepeda (C.F. 25-1479) to Nancy C. Avery, the first African American postmaster of a major post office in the nation (C.F. 24-0370).

Pacoima as a community has produced numerous inspiring figures and leaders and in recognition of the historic neighborhood of Pacoima, it is appropriate that the City designate a segment of Van Nuys Boulevard as "Pueblo Mágico" and install ceremonial signage along this corridor commemorating this magical region of the City.

I THEREFORE MOVE that Van Nuys Boulevard from Laurel Canyon Boulevard to Foothill Boulevard be designated as "Pueblo Mágico" and that the Department of Transportation be directed to erect permanent ceremonial signage to this effect at this location.
