

MOTION

The Twelfth Council District (CD12) has received a request from the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) to donate a Department pick up truck to the Los Angeles Fire Department Historical Society (Historical Society). It is a 1995 GMC 2500 pick up truck (plug buggy). This vehicle is slated to be salvaged and is no longer in use by the Department, creating no impact on operations or the people of Los Angeles.

Section 22.547 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC) provides that upon Council approval, surplus City equipment may be sold for less than market value to a non-profit organization located in the City of Los Angeles when the donation will benefit the residents of the City of Los Angeles. The maintenance and disposal of the surplus equipment would also represent a net financial loss to the City of Los Angeles. The donation of one (1) 1995 GMC 2500 pick up truck will be very useful to the Historical Society in towing other small apparatus to events, securing parts, and picking up equipment, which necessitates the use of one of our volunteer's vehicles at the present time. The fair market value of the equipment is \$3000, which will be forgone revenue should it be donated.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council find that the Los Angeles Fire Department Historical Society is eligible to purchase one (1) 1995 GMC 2500 pick up truck (VIN#1GTGC24K7SE527603), as listed above, at below market value (\$1.00), in accordance with LAAC Sec. 22.547 (Donation of Surplus City Equipment), as the recipient is a non-profit organization located in the City of Los Angeles where the donation will benefit the residents of the City of Los Angeles.

I FURTHER MOVE that the City Attorney be requested to prepare a contract to effectuate the sale and transfer of the surplus equipment identified above at below market value to the Los Angeles Fire Department Historical Society; and

I FURTHER MOVE that the City Clerk be instructed to inform the Los Angeles Fire Department Historical Society [James R. Finn, President, 1355 N. Cahuenga Boulevard, Hollywood, CA 90028, (323) 464-2727] that the surplus equipment must be claimed within 90 days from the date of Council approval of the request or from the notification of equipment availability, whichever occurs later, after which time it will revert to the City's surplus equipment pool for disposal by the Department of General Services.
