Comments for Public Posting: Dear Councilmembers, I am writing to express my deep concern regarding the recent letter submitted by the Los Angeles Police Protective League (LAPPL), in which they threatened litigation over the proposed Charter Reform that would grant the City Council policy authority over the Los Angeles Police Department. This reaction is unreasonable, and it underscores exactly why stronger civilian oversight is urgently needed. For too long, the LAPD's actions have resulted in millions of dollars in liability payouts—money that comes directly from the City's general fund and reduces resources available to departments that are already understaffed and underfunded. The department has repeatedly faced findings of civil rights violations and has even been cited for failing to comply with federal injunctions. This pattern is unacceptable for any public agency, especially one entrusted with public safety. Direct Council oversight is not only appropriate—it is necessary. The City must ensure accountability, transparency, and responsible stewardship of public funds. No department should be allowed to operate without meaningful civilian governance, particularly when its actions have such significant financial and human impacts. Comments for Public Posting: Dear Councilmembers, I respectfully request that you vote YES on CF# 26-1100-S17 to allow Los Angeles voters the opportunity to consider Police Accountability charter reform. Should a second reading be required, I urge you to prioritize this matter during recess so that it may be placed on the ballot. The current Charter exempts the LAPD from compliance with City Council ordinances, limiting the Council's legislative authority over the City's largest department and weakening civilian oversight. As highlighted by Councilmember Hernandez, following last summer's federal immigration raids, the Council introduced 22 LAPD-related motions, none of which became law due to this structural limitation. This reform would correct that imbalance and ensure that the Council's legislative power applies equally across all City departments, including the LAPD. Thank you for your attention and commitment to accountability and good governance. Respectfully, Good Government Advocates
