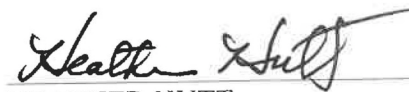
Following his successful banking career, Hutton dedicated himself to serving his community. In his many years giving back to the community, Hutton worked with LA Family Housing, Executive Service Corps, Los Angeles Free Clinic, ONEgeneration, Sunair Children's Foundation, and COPE Health Solutions Foundation.

In addition to his partnerships with local community organizations, Hutton served on multiple committees and commissions concerned with addressing homelessness in the City. Hutton also oversaw an intergenerational tutoring program, working with local libraries to pair senior citizens with students.

Hutton passed away on April 24, 2026 at the age of 85. In recognition of Hutton's legacy of service to his community and the City, it is appropriate that the City name the intersection of Hauser Boulevard and Obama Boulevard as "Nat Hutton Jr. Square."
