

MOTION

The Reynier Village community is a part of a distinguished group of residential neighborhoods within the westside of the City of Los Angeles. The Reynier Village neighborhood was known as Reynier Park in the 1920s and 1930s, although the actual city park was not established until the late 1970s. According to locals, the subdivision was named after a family whose home stood on what is now the city-maintained Reynier Park at 2803 Reynier Avenue.

In 1923, the area's co-owners, Citizens Trust & Savings Bank and Title Insurance & Trust Co., filed to subdivide it into a neighborhood of single-family homes. Soon thereafter, the Reynier Park Improvement Association was created and then affiliated with five other neighborhood groups in 1927. Within Reynier Village, Spanish Revival-style stucco bungalows predominate. Most were built in the late 1920s or 1930s and have two or three bedrooms. They intermingle with an eclectic assortment of pitch-roofed cottages and tract houses; many painted in rainbow hues or earth tones.

Identifying existing unique and distinct communities within in the City of Los Angeles fosters community pride and a sense of community empowerment. The South Robertson Neighborhood Council supports this local effort for the installation of signs identifying the Reynier Village community.

I THEREFORE MOVE that all relevant City departments be instructed to perform the necessary requirements to effectuate the naming of the Reynier Village community bounded by Holt Avenue on the east, Cadillac Avenue on the north, Robertson Boulevard on the west and by Cattaraugus Avenue on the south including, but not limited to, the installation of signs.
